TRAVEL GRANT FOR QUESTNET WINTER NETWORKSHOP

I am writing to you to advise you about travel grant support available through the Department of Business, Industry and Regional Development, to assist your institution to send delegates to the QUESTnet winter networkshop to be held at James Cook University in Townsville from 16 to 18 July 1991. The Department is the major sponsor of the conference, entitled "Regional development through computer networks", details of which are set out in the enclosed brochure.

QUESTnet Conference and Workshop

In line with the theme of "Regional Development Through Computer Networks" the QUESTnet Workshop and Conference will be held at James Cook University. This is the first time we have had the opportunity to hold this Workshop outside of Brisbane. Also it is the first time that this event has been specifically oriented to "end user" application of networks.

A laboratory of terminals and workstations will be available for the use of, and for demonstrations by, the delegates.

The QUESTnet Management Committee will also meet during this conference to plan the further staged development of networking facilities in Queensland.
