1. WELCOME

The Chairman opened the meeting at 9.30 am. The Chairman welcomed all the members of the meeting and thanked them for their attendance. Members were advised that the AARNet members had been delayed.

2. APOLOGIES

There were no apologies; all members were present orrepresented. Rod Ibell was representing the University of SouthernQueensland in place of Alan McMeekin who was on leave. Shelley Schmidt was representing DBIRD (Department of Business Industry and RegionalDevelopment) representing Alan Hayman who was unable to attend.

3. ADDITIONS AND CHANGES TO THEAGENDA

The order of the agenda items was modified todelay items of specific AARNet involvement until the AARNet representativesarrived.

4. CONFIRMATION OF PREVIOUS MINUTES

The minutes of the previous meeting were confirmed.

5. BUSINESS ARISING FROM PREVIOUSMINUTES NOT COVERED ELSEWHERE

5.1 Government Relations (Items 3.1,3.2, 4.1, and 4.2 of 29 Nov 92)

This issue will now be covered and addressed as part of the QOLN agenda item.

5.2 AARNet Disaster Recovery/Backup (Item 8.0a of 29 Nov 92)

Action: Geoff Huston to develop are port on disaster recovery/backup facilities for AARNet.

5.3 24 Hr, Seven day week Hub Support (Item 15 of 29 Nov 92)

Action: Geoff Huston toconsider cost implications for the AARNet budget for widening the supportprovided by Regional Hubs.

5.4 Access to AARNet by Students form OtherInstitutions (Item 10 of 19 Feb 93)

Action: Ian Hunter todistribute details of the JCU policy and procedures in place for access forstudents from other institutions. This may be used as the basis for aQUESTNet policy.

5.5 AARNet Affiliate Charges (Item11 of 19 Feb 93)

Action: Ian Hunter to draw upinstitutional guidelines and prices for connection of AARNet affiliatesthat complements the AARNet policy.

5.6 Institution Voice Links (Item 14 of 19 Feb 93)

Action: Rod Ibell to coordinate the investigation of the use of QUESTNet links to carry voice traffic between QUESTNet institutions.

6. JCU/QDPI INSTITUTE FOR TROPICALNATURAL RESOURCES

While not directly involved with the project, Ian Huntergave a brief report based on the information he had received.

The project is still proceeding although, apparently, there issome disagreement between QDPI and JCU regarding the equipment to bepurchased. In any event, the acquisition would have to go to tender.

The funds are meant to be committed by 30 June 1993, but there is strongdoubts if this is possible. The siting of a supercomputer at JCU, it hasbeen suggested, will affect the traffic on the JCU-UQ link.

7. SUPERCOMPUTER INITIATIVES

Shelley Schmidt indicated that the Government is stillmoving to appoint a consultant to develop a proposal by 31 July. Memberswere generally of the opinion that this target was extremelyoptimistic.

John Noad reported on the Mechanism C Grant. The money(\$1.3M) has to be committed by the end of 1993 and the working party is nowproceeding on the basis of a separate acquisition to any State Government plans. Professor Paul Pritchard (Griffith) is developing the draft proposal.

WELCOME (Contd.) 1.

At this point the AARNet members (Geoff Huston and Peter Saalmans) arrived. On behalf of the members, the Chairman welcomed the new General Manager of AARNet to his first QUESTNet meeting, congratulated him on his appointment, and indicated that QUESTNet looked forward to developing a cooperative working relationship with him inthe future.

QUESTNET/AARNET RELATIONSHIP 8.

Alan Coulter spoke to a draft paper that represented the collective views of the Queensland institutions regarding the development of an ongoing relationship.

(Secretary's note: Rather than paraphrase Alan Coulter'spaper, a full copy of the paper will be circulated separately tomembers.)

Geoff Huston welcomed the input and saw it as being valuable to the discussion and evolution of the relationship. He suggested that this paper should be presented to the AARNet Board of Management for itsnext meeting in early June. He also saw value in the Old Vice-Chancellors indicating their support for this position.

Alan Coulter to refinethe paper and circulate to Directors for presentation to their respectiveVice-Chancellors. and for endorsement of this position to be conveyed tothe AARNet Board of Management.

QUEENSLAND OPEN LEARNING NETWORK 9.

At the previous meeting of QUESTNet, Ian Jenkins wasnominated as the convenor of a working party to investigate issues associated with expansion of QUESTNET to satisfy the demands of OOLN.

Associated with this investigation, Ian Jenkins and Shelley Schmidt metwith representatives from a number of Government Departments, including TAFE, to look at State communications links. Interestingly, the vastmajority of those present had not heard of QUESTNet, while a few had at least heard of AARNet.

As a consequence of this meeting, it was agreed that there was adefinite need to promote QUESTNet, AARNet, and their resources to the Stage Government Departments. It was suggested that a breakfast seminar would be appropriate, possiblyfollowed by a workshop.

Action:

Graham Rees and ShelleySchmidt to coordinate arrangements for a briefing seminar on QUESTNet atits resources for State Government Departments.

Associated with this issue, the need for the development of promotional material was recognised to complement the material promoting the resources of the Internet.. No specific action was agreed upon at this stage.

AARNET MICROWAVE RATIONALISATION 10.

Geoff Huston briefed the meeting on the Microwaveproposals received from the various states. In addition to the Qldproposal, the other proposals included:

\$500K (plus \$500Kmatching funds) SA

WA

\$250K (plus CSIRO funds)

ACT \$250K NSW \$110K (inc UTS, Macquarie, and CSIRO)

Geoff Huston indicated that it was envisaged that suchmicrowave technology would be cost effective for the next 3/4 year period; thereafter, later technology would need to be introduced to provide GBcapacity.

Discussion took place regarding the suitability of thistechnology and the need for it to be introduced quickly.

It was resolved that:

microwave is the most appropriate technology to satisfy existingand near-term

communications needs;

the AARNet Board of Management should proceed with evaluating and

fundingthese proposals as a matter of urgency; and

the AARNet Engineering and Advisory Group be involved in the

technicalevaluation and consideration of technical options.

Action:

Alan Coulter to write to the AARNet Board of Management requesting the Board

to proceed on this matterwith urgency.

11. INTERIM BOARD MEETING OF SERT

An meeting of the Interim Board of Management of SERTwas held with all QUESTNet members attending as members or guests.

The minutes of this meeting will be circulated as separatecorrespondence. It should noted for the record that SERT has been renamedACSAS (Australian Computer Security Advisory Service).

12. WINTER WORKSHOP (QUESTNET'93)PLANNING

Ian Jenkins tabled a draft Workshop program and spoke to the item. Shelley Schmidt advised themeeting that Alan Hayman (DBIRD) had indicated that DBIRD would contribute\$10,000 towards QUESTNet'93. Discussion followed and the following actionwas agreed.

Subsequent discussion regarding the '94 Workshop to beheld at USQ resolved that the provisional theme would be "Wide-area networkaccess for educational activities".

13. AARNET AFFILIATE MEMBERSHIP

There was general agreement that the policies and procedures on the affiliate membership program were unclear and it was agreed that improved documentation was required.

Geoff Huston todocument and distribute policies and procedures associated with the Affiliate Membership program to help and guide institutions in dealing with potential affiliates.

14. AARNET DEVELOPMENTS

Geoff Huston gave a verbal report on AARNet developmentssince the last meeting. The major events included the following:

Peter Saalmans commenced duties as GeneralManager;

Peter Elford resigned in January; Mark Turner has been appointed to replace Peter Elford;

the link to the US was upgraded from 500kb to 768kb and was saturatedin less than two weeks;

the link to WA was increased to 2mb; and links to PNG and FIJI are in advancedplanning.

Geoff indicated that links to the Australian Federal Policeare planned. He also foreshadowed that, from April 1994, the NSFnet will "close down" and, therefore, the link to Europe is compromised. Thismatter is still unresolved.

Alan Coulter commented on the extremely difficult environmentthat Geoff had been working under during the past months and thanked himfor his efforts during this difficult period.
