NETWORKSHOP '91

The seventh Australian Networkshop will be held at the University of Tasmania in Hobart from 2nd to 4th December 1991. Networkshop '91 is the annual national workshop of the academic and research networking community. The workshop is expected to attract up to 200 people involved in networking, computer-based communications and usage of electronic communications from throughout Australia and New Zealand.

Networkshop '91 is sponsored by the Australian Academic and Research Network (AARNet). A significant amount of time at Networkshop '91 will be spent discussing issues related to the continuing design and usage of AARNet. AARNet has been in operation for eighteen months and significant information has been gathered on its efficiency and effectiveness.

FOCUS

Networkshop '91 will focus on how the services of a national network like AARNet can be diversified and expanded to meets the need of the academic and research community for which it is designed. This focus will include discussions of the engineering problems faced in expanding the range of facilities and services offered over such a network.

In particular, Networkshop '91 will focus on the following issues:

- o proposals for innovative new uses of electronic communication media
- o case studies illustrating significant uses of computer networks
- o users' perspectives on the future provisions of communication services

Presentations addressing these issues will be most welcomed.

Historically the Networkshop has concentrated on the technical and managerial issues of establishing a national network. With the wide accessibility of services like AARNet, Networkshop '91 provides an opportunity for users to discuss and present their needs, and seek solutions from communication engineers and managers.
