Hi,

In December 1992, the Australian Vice-Chancellors Committee recommended that an AARNet Engineering Working Group (AEWG) should be established. The envisaged role of the AEWG will be to provide technical advice to the AARNet Technical Manager on issues affecting the performance and future directions internetworking and the Internet in Australia, as well as being actively involved in the development and deployment of relevant internetworking technologies. The AEWG will consist of networking experts from around Australia working in both open groups and dedicated work areas based around the network engineering and network operational agenda of both AARNet and AARNet's clients.

In recognition of your contributions to internetworking in Australia you are invited to join the AARNet Engineering Working Group as an initial core member.

The Working Group will be self-funding - that is, no budget is being allocated by AARNet to support meetings of this body. Members of the Working Group will be expected to meet their own expenses in attending and undertaking activities associated with the group.
